International Activities

Developed and co-directed a Youth Development Service-Learning study Abroad

I co-developed the UF in Ireland Youth Development Service-Learning Study Abroad Program and two supporting courses (i.e., FYC4950 Ireland Field Study and FYC 4951 Youth Serve Culture). One of the only programs of its kind, it provides students with a six-week, service-learning experience within the context of youth development in Galway and Gweedore, Ireland. Since its inception in 2017, a total of 77 undergraduate students from nine majors have completed this program.

Outcomes/Impacts:

Student outcomes include developing leadership, collaboration, and confidence building skills. Students also reported increased empathy, adaptability, relationship building skills with peers and Irish citizens, and an increased sense of trust.

Scholarship of Teaching studies that I conducted to measure these outcomes have been used to support my research program, resulting in refereed presentations at 9 international conferences and 2 national conferences and 3 refereed journal articles published.

Supporting Youth Development Professionals' work in 4-H Development Programs

1. PYD/youth leadership/Civic Engagement

Provide support and guidance to the Leadership/Citizenship Action Team. Over the last five years training, curriculum, and experiential learning activities have been implemented for over 55,000 youth (11,000 per year) enrolled in the leadership/citizenship project.

Outcomes/Impact: 4-H members report learning leadership and life skills through the mentorship they received helping to prepare them for their future endeavors.

2. Developing youth development professionals

A. Understanding Recruitment and Retention in the 4-H Club Program

HATCH Multistate Project

Active member of a multi-state research collaboration of 10 states and 20 Faculty developing a framework to build capacities and skills as well as address the retention of 4-H youth across the nation through the qualitative concepts of belonging, communication, and organization. Now in the second phase of the study, objectives are to provide training based on research to i mprove the 4-H member experience.

Outcomes/Impact: Overall youth self-reported 4.20 (out of 5) that that they had a positive experience in 4-H. Youth reported that building relationships with peers, learning about their projects and how to better serve their communities was the best part of 4-H.

Why 4-H County Faculty Stay

Through my work as 4-H Specialist in Organizational Systems, after recognizing high turnover amongst the 4-H Youth Development County Faculty appointments, a collaboration and ad hoc committee was to examine why county faculty, specifically 4-H Youth Development Professionals stay. A mixed method study examining these factors was conducted and findings were reported to administrators.

Outcomes/Impact: The top theme that arose describing why a 4-H Youth Development County Faculty stays with UF/IFAS Extension in their current role is that they are passionate about working with young people, they have administrative support, and a flexible work environment. They also reported that their direct supervisor understands their program area. They also found support from others and had formed strong partnerships. Administrators have made intentional efforts to create organizational change that embraces these findings to ensure more 4-H Youth Development County Faculty will be retained in years to come.

B. Collaborating with Youth Development Professionals to build Community Capacity

Partnered with UF Faculty and the Center for Public Issues Education in Agriculture and Natural Resources providing in-service trainings at UF/IFAS Extension Symposiums and facilitate county strategic planning sessions to enhance community capacity in rural and urban communities.

Outcomes/Impact: Counties have developed and implemented action plans, 10-year strategic plans, and community resilience plans to enhance their resilience.

C. Preventing Youth Opioid Use in Rural Communities

To expand community capacity and resilience, a federally funded grant supports a team of UF and County Extension faculty from four rural counties to implement the PROmoting School-community-university Partnerships to Enhance Resilience (PROSPER) evidence-based

delivery system for supporting sustained, community-based implantation of scientifically proven programs for youth and their families.

I serve as Co-Pi and a bridge between county 4-H faculty from four rural counties and the UF state management team who use an evidence-based delivery system for supporting sustained, community-based implantation of scientifically proven programs for youth and their families.

Outcomes/Impact: The program is already showing outcomes and impacts as Strengthening families program youth reported an improved future orientation, ability to change behavior, improved family communication, and family problem solving. The program has currently reached 325 6th graders participating in the Botvin Life Skills Training. Participants (n=103) of Botvin Life Skills Training (BLT) training completed a pre (m=7.96) and post (m=8.45) test on life Skills knowledge gain showing a difference of means of >49. The increase in knowledge is significant with a p-value of .00.

Outcomes/Impact: Nineteen families completed the Strengthening Families program and is continuing through August 2026. Parents self-reported significant improvement in their ability to set rules around substance use and to set consistent expectations for their child's behavior. They also reported improved family problem solving and exhibited more positive parenting behaviors.

D. Building Steps to Success for Youth Professionals in Rural Communities

The rural Youth Fellows Program (YRF) was designed for undergraduate students to engage in service-learning experiences through internships in UF/IFAS Extension. UF state and county faculty collaborated with undergraduate students in their courses to identify a community issue affecting the youth in the counties they would work in as an intern with during the summer semester after taking FYC 4301 Engaging Communities in Decision Making. Student fellows were mentored through the process of conducting needs assessments and developing their summer community-based action plans to improve the health and well-being of youth in select rural communities.

Outcomes/Impact: Results showed that undergraduate fellows developed a greater appreciation of the challenges of rural life, more positive attitudes towards working in rural communities, and were provided with opportunities to further develop their youth development professional skills.

3. Risk management for those engaged in youth programming

Support the Florida 4-H youth development professionals and program in conducting educational events and activities that coincide with the 4-H mission and mandates while protecting the safety of participants, sponsors, finances, and the goodwill/reputation of the 4-H name.

Lead the 4-H Youth Development Program through a significant cultural change regarding the necessity of mitigating potential inherent risks involved when managing a youth development

program. Coordinated an intentional Risk Management for 4-H Youth Development Work initiative involving 4-H Professionals in writing a series of 11 EDIS documents on risk and liability management. Provided support and in-service trainings.

Outcomes/Impact: 4-H Professionals have increased engagement with complying with Florida Statutes, University of Florida Office of Youth Compliance Services Policies, and UF/IFAS procedures.

Collaborated with UF Faculty and Extension professionals to develop 9 in-service trainings for volunteers operating concessions, fundraising, and other food events across the state of Florida. A total of 131 volunteers and county faculty attended a one-day training to learn safe food handling practices for UF/IFAS Extension events.

Outcomes/Impact: Fifty-three (53) participants, representing a 40% response rate reported adoption and implementation of the following food practices: 41 of 47 (87%) reported having a food thermometer at the volunteer location for Extension programs. 43 of 47 (91%) reported correct use and cleaning of cutting boards.
