

Human Subjects Research (HSR) Training

You must complete the required training for conduct human subjects research (HSR). Go to the UF [Internal Review Board](https://irb.ufl.edu) (IRB) home website for instructions about how get access to IRB and complete the training. There are two IRB boards at UF. IRB-02 reviews and monitors human subject research conducted at UF that involved behavioral observations/recordings, non-invasive physiological recordings, analysis of documents that were previously gathered for non-research purposes, evaluation of behavioral/social interventions or manipulations, educational assessments, interviews, surveys, cognitive tests, and taste/food evaluations of wholesome food within FDA regulations. IRB-01 reviews and monitors human subject research that involves invasive procedures such as medical interventions. The IRB-01 and IRB-02 boards have the SAME training requirements. Find the link "Required Training for UF IRBs" on the left side of the home page. From the Home Page for IRB, click IRB-02 on the banner. There is only one version of training possible – IRB 803. Click that link and when the new window opens, click University of Florida – this sends you to the board that deals with non-invasive data collection. You will then have to login using your UF username and password to get to the actual training. The training will take approximately 1.5 to 2 hours in my experience. You must submit proof of completion of the required training for IRB02 through Canvas. A screen shot of the certificate of completion with your scores on it is sufficient.
